

CHASING WARRIORS REVEALS A DECADE LONG PURSUIT TO CONQUER THE BEST RANGER COMPETITION

Steve Greer shares a candid account of perseverance, failure, leadership, and the relentless pursuit of excellence among Army Rangers.

New York, NY, August, 2026 — Author and retired Command Sergeant Major Steve Greer takes readers inside an extraordinary military challenge in *Chasing Warriors: A Decade Long Pursuit to Win Best Ranger*. A former Ranger and Green Beret, Greer recounts a mission that stretched across nearly ten years as he pursued success in the Best Ranger Competition while progressing from Staff Sergeant to Sergeant Major. His story reaches beyond physical endurance, examining the discipline, determination, disappointment, and personal sacrifice required to continue pursuing an elusive goal when walking away would have been far easier.

The memoir examines leadership through action, showing how humility, discipline, resilience, and example can influence others more powerfully than position alone. Greer's experiences offer a perspective on continuing after failure, enduring uncertainty, and remaining committed when the desired outcome feels increasingly distant. For military readers, veterans, leaders, athletes, and anyone pursuing an ambitious objective, the story presents perseverance not as an abstract principle, but as a demanding practice tested repeatedly under pressure.
